NORTH CAROLINA SHELTERS FORCED TO CLOSE DUE TO FLOODING

Hurricane Matthew's Wrath Has Left Many Shelters Closed and Many Animals
Homeless

CHARLOTTE, N.C., Oct. 12, 2016 – Several animal shelters in North Carolina have had to face the intensity of Hurricane Matthew this past week. The American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals would like to bring awareness to the current plight that these shelters are facing. Many of these shelters are experiencing power outages, dwindling resources, and flooding, and therefore are no longer safe for the employees or the animals. These shelters have been evacuated. However, this means that many animals are in need of shelter, food, and other basic supplies. The ASPCA has been working with many shelters to try and find some relief for the employees, volunteers and the animals. So far, about half of the displaced animals have found temporary homes until the shelters can reopen. Some employees and volunteers have been able to foster the animals, but it is not enough. CEO Matthew E. Bershadker commented, "In this time of need, shelters are desperate for any type of aid. It has been incredibly rewarding in the past to see the national community of animal lovers band together to help out during these natural disasters. I know that I can trust the American people to come to the rescue again."
